Old Business:

- COVID-19 Update: Nothing new, President Kiler will update everyone via e.mail if any changes or new regulations occur
- NCHS Update: TL updated
  - Winter times are all booked
  - Costs are covered under Tax Credit until the cap is reached.
  - Coppermine asked us to pay part of the fees but the Executive Board feels we should first exhaust the tax credit to remain fiscally responsible to the NCRC programs.
- Replay Hampstead Please keep this program in mind when you see equipment need in you program or if you have equipment no longer needed which you could donate. This is a local young member of our community and we as a rec council feel supporting him is important.
- Cape Horn Light Plan work was to begin in July delayed

New Business:

- Self Help Applications are due in September. As soon as President Kiler receives official information, he will send it to all programs. Apply and submit to the Council. The Executive Board will prioritize requests.
- Hall of Fame (20+ years of service to NCRC) and Volunteer of the Year nominations are needed soon. President Kiler will forward details and deadlines as soon as they are provided. Please be thinking of VoTY candidates and let the Executive Board know of anyone in you programs who have served for 20 or more years. The event recognizing these volunteers will be held November 10, 2022, at the Carroll Arts Center.
- Health Checks: If you have not turned your program's Health Check in, please do so ASAP
- Program Issues/ Executive Board Notification: The Executive Board discussed asking Programs to notify them of any program changes which might then result in a concern or complaint. It was decided by the Executive Board that programs do not need to notify the board of internal decisions (i.e., not fielding a team at a certain level due to lack of enrollment) because program coordinators already had enough on their plates. As stated in the bylaws, any program wide cancelations still require Executive Board notification.
- Stone Alley / Team Snap: Many of our programs use Team Snap and we have received several requests to look into what they offer and whether it made sense to subscribe at a NCRC level for all programs. President Kile did his due diligence and researched Team Snap. Though they state all fees are deposited within a short period of time, their per participant and processing fees are higher than Stone Alley. No change will occur. The Executive Board will revisit the request next year. Programs can individually continue to use Team Snap but Stone Alley will remain our registration platform. The Executive Board will continue to work with Stone Alley to be sure payments are posted on a "next month" basis.
